

Origami Frog



Materials Needed:

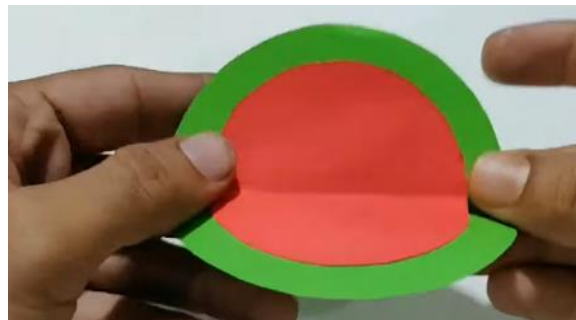
- ✓ Green paper
- ✓ Red paper
- ✓ Glue
- ✓ Scissors
- ✓ Yellow marker
- ✓ Black marker
- ✓ Googly eyes (optional)

Steps:

1. Draw a large circle on a piece of green paper and a medium circle on a piece of red paper. Carefully cut them out.



2. Fold each circle in half. Glue the red circle inside the folded green circle.



3. Draw and cut out two small ovals on your green paper. These will be for the eyes.
4. Fold the ovals in half and glue them onto the large circle so that the openings face the folded edge of the body.



5. Use a marker to draw on a nose and eye! (optional: use googly eyes)



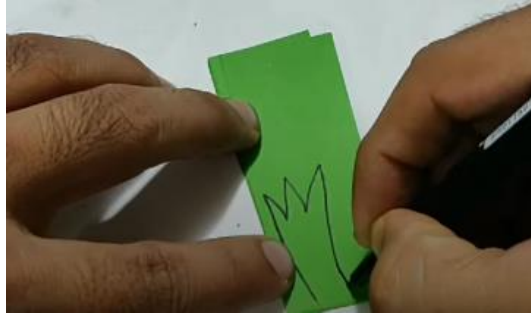
6. Use a yellow marker to draw spots on your frog's face. (Optional: cut out small yellow circles and glue them on instead of drawing the spots)



7. Draw four equal sized rectangle on green paper and cut them out.



8. Stack the rectangles and use your marker to draw a foot-shape on the top piece of paper.



9. While the rectangles are stacked, carefully cut out the foot-shape.



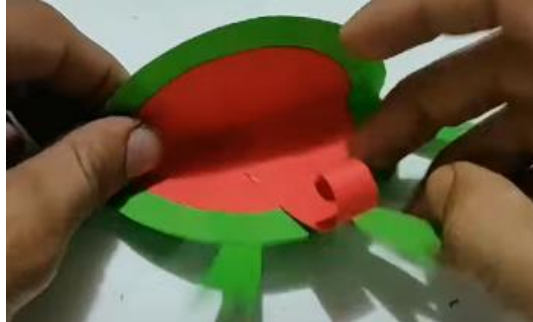
10. Glue two feet near the front of the frog, and two on the side edges by the fold.



11. Draw and cut out a long, skinny rectangle on your red paper. This is the tongue!



12. Curl one end of the tongue by rolling it, and glue the flat end into the frog's mouth.



Additional Skill Practice:

Here are some additional skills you can work on with your kiddo related to this craft:

- Color identification – what colors are on your frog?
- Shape Identification – what shapes did you use?
- 1:1 correspondence – how many feet/ eyes/ spots are there?
- Animal sounds – what sound does a frog make?
- Movement – jump like a frog!
