

3D Tulip Card



Materials Needed:

- ✓ White paper
- ✓ Dark pink paper
- ✓ Light pink paper
- ✓ Red paper (optional)
- ✓ Green paper
- ✓ Pencil
- √ Scissors
- ✓ Glue

Steps:

1. Draw a big heart on pink paper for the base of your card. To help make it symmetrical, you can fold your paper in half and draw half of a heart. Cut it out!





2. Draw a smaller heart on white paper and cut it out. Glue it in the middle of the pink one.





3. Draw two leaves on your green paper and cut them out.





4. Draw a small, skinny rectangle on your green paper and cut it out. Glue it on your white heart so that the bottom of the rectangle is at the bottom point of the heart.



5. Glue the leaves on the sides of the stem.



6. Fold the heart in half.





7. Draw a tulip shape on light pink paper and cut it out. (TIP: you can break the shape down by making a large U and drawing a W to connect the end points of the U)



- 8. Use the tulip as a template to trace on your paper and create 5 more flowers. You can use the same color, or trace 2 one pink and 3 on red so that the petals alternate.
- 9. After all petals are drawn, cut them out, and fold them in half.



10. Glue the folded halve to each other to create a stack of tulip halves.





11. Apply glue to the outside petals and place on the top of your stem. Close the card and press to secure the flowers. Let dry before opening!





Additional Skill Practice:

Here are some additional skills you can work on with your kiddo related to this craft:

- Handwriting write your name on the back to sign your card.
- 1:1 Counting how many tulip halves are there all together?
- Receptive Identification what is inside the card? What shape is the card?
