

Planet Earth



Materials Needed:

- ✓ Paper plate
- ✓ Blue paint
- ✓ Green paper
- ✓ White paper
- √ Scissors
- ✓ Glue
- ✓ Black marker
- ✓ Googly eyes (optional)

Steps:

1. Paint the back of a paper plate with blue paint. Set aside until it is dry.




2. Cut out a few pieces of green paper. This is for the land, so the shapes can be wavy, jagged, or whatever shape you would like! Glue the landforms to your Earth once the paint is dried.






3. Cut out four strips of white paper.



4. Accordion fold the four strips. To accordion fold: start by folding one end so that it looks like a small square, flip it over, fold until the end looks like a square again, and repeat until the entire strip is folded.



5. Glue two white strips to the sides of your Earth, and glue the other two to the bottom of your Earth.





6. Add a fun face! You can use googly eyes if you have them, or you can use a marker to

draw.



Additional Skill Practice:

Here are some additional skills you can work on with your kiddo related to this craft:

- 1:1 Counting how many continents (the green pieces of paper) does your Earth have?
- Color identification what colors are on your Earth?
- Imaginative play take your planet Earth on an adventure outside!
